We want to look at the role of the autonomous women's movement in the struggle for overall social change, as well as the role of socialist feminists.

The last IWDC meetings gave support to an educational programme centring around these questions. Our next meeting will finalize our approach and plans. More information on specific dates and topics will be sent out later in the summer for the fall discussions.
