We are involved in organizing a Women's Solidarity Picket to support the strikers at Irwin Toy. The Irwin Toy Company is one of the biggest names in the business of amusements and games for children. But, it can't even treat its own employees like human beings! Most of the workers at Irwin Toy are women-and most earn only minimum wage. They have no sick pay rights and no senority rights.

Last winter they decided they needed a union and joined the United Steelworkers. After weeks of negotiations for a first contract, the company offered an extra nickel to its minimum wage earners. Could you raise a family on \$3.55 an hour?

The 104 workers at Irwin Toy went on strike on June 17th to win their right to a union and to take a first step towards the dignity and justice they deserve.
