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with Mrs. Margaret Ware, the Executive Secretary of the Women's Advisory Committee.

The New Feminist wanted to find out what advice the Women's Advisory Committee was giving the government regarding women and where we could get copies of their briefs and reports.

Our interest in the subject was aroused by a "Resume of Activities, Women's Advisory Committee," put out by the WAC.

"The committee has a two-fold function. It transmits to government, through the Minister of the Department of Trade and Development, its findings on matters pertinent to the economic position of women. Matters of prime concern to consumers are also studied and recommendations made. The Chairman represents the women on inter-departmental committees of the Government and often the Advisory Committee members are given the task of gathering together information for study on the part of these coordinated committees. In turn, matters of legislation concern are presented to the committee for study and recommendations."

New Feminist: Do you report directly to Mr. Randall in briefs and reports?

Margaret Ware: Yes.

- New Feminist: Where can these reports be read or seen, are they available?
- Margaret Ware: They aren't available really. Some of them are inter-office memos. Some of them are confidential.
- Translation: These reports are top secret and mustn't fall into the hands of the enemy.

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New Feminist: Who chooses the women on the committee?

Margaret Ware: Mrs. Lymburner, after much enquiry of course.

Translation: Imagine, 24 Lilah Lymburner's on the WAC - who needs a Royal Commission on the Status of Women.

New Feminist: Do you have a research staff?

- Margaret Ware: ... the man who writes the speeches for Mr. Randall and us does research for them.... and then there are the DBS and other reports.

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"IS IT GOVERNMENT WINDOW-DRESSING?"

A recently published pamphlet, Advisory Boards and Councils, by the Canadian Association of Adult Education asks that question of advisory boards and committees. It also asks "whether governments are not really 'playing games' in setting them up. Is the whole elaborate business not really an exercise in window-dressing?"

Another question asked by the CAAE is pertinent to the Women's Advisory Committee. "In the first place, why do governments create advisory boards? Do they really believe them to be a source of valuable advice from the outside, or do they see them chiefly as a means of promoting good public relations?"

THIS IS WHAT WE THINK

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The Women's Advisory Committee is a fraud.

The Women's Advisory Committee is a laugh.

The Women's Advisory Committee is an insult to intelligent women.

The Women's Advisory Committee is not an advisory committee. What advice has it ever given? What brief? What report?

The so called Women's Advisory Committee is not a WOMEN'S advisory committee at all. It's only researcher is a man. He writes speeches for Mrs. Lymburner and Mr. Randall.

The 24 women on the advisory committee represent no one but themselves. They are delegated by no constituancy but are co-opted by Mrs. Lymburner - who herself has no mandate to speak for women, but is purely a mouthpiece of the Trade Department of the Ontario Government.

Here is a sample of her luminous promouncements:

"Many women make no connection between what they spend and the good times they enjoy." (Globe and Mail)

As for Mr. Randall, it is clear what century he lives in - see his statement on todays program:

"Progress is like a wheelbarrow ... "

Mr. Randall shows an acute understanding of women in his statement on the same program:

"...Women are one of the major and magic ingredients that make our economy work." an ter when when the states.

MAGIC Mr. Randall? Now really !!!

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What the Women's Advisory Committee really does is hold 10 tea parties a year for women who have the time to attend them. In return for a free meal women enjoy the benifit of the Ontario Government commercial.

"You are probably the only people who have a made-to-order built-in opportunity to foster a greater interest in Ontario and Canadian crafts and their development." said Mrs. Lymburner, talking to women.

"If we (women) in Ontario could find but one article which would catch on as this (the Oopik) did or as Mexican blown glass birds and animals and hand-made raffia in Italy did - and it could be done through your co-operation - it would be a tremendous contribution to the Trade Crusade, and the economy of our country."
