

WHAT IS O.W.W.?

Organized Working Women (O.W.W.) is women working together to improve our conditions at home and in the workplace.

O.W.W.'s goal is to increase women's participation in unions, while strengthening the labour movement as a whole.

As unionists, we fight for our rights at work alongside our sisters and brothers in the labour movement. As women, we strive for equality at all levels of society.



WHO CAN JOIN?

O.W.W. voting membership is open to all women covered by a bona fide collective bargaining unit or union organizing committee.

Unorganized women and male trade unionists may join O.W.W. as friends and enjoy all membership privileges, except for voting or election to the Executive Council.

HOW WE BEGAN

- O.W.W. was first conceived in 1975, when a women's conference called Women in the Workforce, It's About Time, elected a committee to initiate a union women's organization.
- Less than a year later, in March 1976, a convention of union women founded Organized Working Women.
- On February 12, 1985 more than 40 union women assembled to establish the Ottawa chapter of O.W.W.

WHY A WOMEN'S LABOUR **ORGANIZATION?**

Whether it was for the right to vote or the right to join a union, women have been fighting for equality for almost a century.

Sure, our lives have improved! But, there still is a large gap between men and women. As a group, women earn only 60% of men's wages. And government cutbacks in social services such as daycare threaten our right to work.

Women in O.W.W. feel that the labour movement must play a leading role in the area of women's rights. But, fighting for equality does not end at our workplace — that's only half the battle!

We want to ensure that equality exists in legislation, in the home, and in our unions.
