

WHAT IS IT?

The Immigrant Women's Health Centre is a counselling and referral service in the preventive method of health care. It is provided exclusively for immigrant women.

In operation since 1975, the centre's main objective is to promote reproductive health with emphasis on family planning and related health matters. In addition, they will help immigrant women increase their knowledge of their rights as patients and consumers, and they will teach them to have a positive appreciation of their sexuality and life.

THE STAFF

The staff at the health centre are helpful, caring counsellors with years of experience behind them.

In a relaxed atmosphere, trained health counsellors will provide women with useful advise and printed material in their own language:

Chinese, Spanish, Vietnamese, Portuguese, Italian or English.

The counsellors know the language of their clients and can relate to them, their cultural differences and the problems of particular concern to immigrant women upon arrival in Canada.
