THE FOLLOWING MESSAGE WAS RECEIVED FROM DIA:

AT 9:15 AM TODAY (JULY 20/81) THE REGIONAL OFFICE OF THE DIA WAS PARTIALLY OCCUPIED BY 30-40 INDIAN PEOPLE.

MOSTLY WOMEN WHO STATED THAT THEY DID NOT REPRESENT CHIEFS OR COUNCIL OR ANY POLITICAL ASSOCIATION, BUT THAT THEY HAD A NUMBER OF CONCERNS THEY REFUSED TO DISCUSS THOSE CONCERNS WITH ME. THIS OCCUPANCY HAS CAUSED AN INTERRUPTION IN SERVICES AND HAS THEREFORE REQUIRED ME TO CLOSE DOWN THE REGIONAL OFFICE UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.

ME FOLLOWING IS A MESSAGE FROM

DISTRICT OFFICES WILL STAY OPEN AND PROVIDE SERVICES AS USUAL.

\*SHOULD IT BE NECESSARY FOR REGIONL STAFF TO MEET WITH BAND
COUNCILS, WE WILL ATTEMPT TO DO SO AT THE DISTRICT OR RESERVE
LEVEL.

THIS ORGANIZATION WAS SET UP BY A GROUP OF WOMEN WITHOUT ANY THIS ORGANIZATION WAS SET UP BY A GROUP OF WOMEN WITHOUT ANT ORGANIZATIONS BACKING IT. IT WAS DONE THROUGH FRUSTRATION JUST PLAIN FED UP WITH THE WAY WE ARE TREATED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF INDIAN AFFAIRS, COUNCILS AND INDIAN ORGANIZATIONS. THE OF INDIAN AFFAIRS, COUNCILS AND INDIAN ORGANIZATIONS. THE MONEY IS GOING EVERYWHERE BUT TO THE COMMUNITY LEVEL PEOPLE. THE PITTANCE THAT INDIAN ORGANIZATIONS DO GET THEY ARE FIGHTING OVER.

THE STAND WE ARE MAKING AS 'CONCERNED ABORIGINAL WOMEN' IS BORN FROM FRUSTRATIONS SUFFERED AT THE HANDS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF INDIAN AFFAIRS AND DIFFERENT ORGANIZATIONS. THE BAND LEVEL PEOPLE HAVE SO MANY DIFFERENT ORGANIZATIONS WORKING ON THEIR BEHALF THAT THE SITUATIONS AT THE BAND LEVEL ARE WORSENING. THE POVERTY THAT PEOPLE ARE EXPERIENCING AT THE BAND LEVEL ARE CAUSED BY THE CONTROLS SET UP BY GOVERNMENT POLICIES. POLICIES ARE NOT GIVEN IN THE INTERESTS OF PEOPLE BUT IN THE INTERESTS OF GOVERNMENT BUREAUCRATS. THE CUT-BACKS IMPOSED BY GOVERNMENT ON THE DEPARTMENT OF INDIAN AFFAIRS IS FELT HARDEST BY THE BAND MEMBERS AT THE COMMUNITY LEVEL. WE HAVE NO SECURITY SUCH AS THE OTHER WORKER GROUPS HAVE IN THAT WE CANNOT STRIKE TO BRING OUR STANDARD OF LIVING UP TO PAR WITH THE REST OF THE COUNTRY. THE WORKERS AT THE COMMUNITY LEVEL ARE AT THE MERCY OF THE PEOPLE WHO ARE DOLING OUT THE MONEY. OUR RESOURCES ARE NOT BEING USED TO MAKE LIFE BETTER FOR COMMUNITY PEOPLE AS A WHOOOOOLE BUT HELP DEVELOP CORPORATIONS OF RICH INDIVIDUALS.

FRED WALCHLI: WE WON'T TALK TO HIM BECAUSE WE DON'T TRUST HIM, BECAUSE OF THE WAY HE HAS HANDLED OTHER SITUATIONS DEALING WITH INDIANS.

- A) BANDS ARE CONTINUOUSLY WAITING FOR FUNDING FOR BAND OPERATIONS. THIS CAUSED ALOT OF FRUSTRATION BEING SUFFERED BY THE COMMUNITY PEOPLE AND WORKERS AT THE COMMUNITY LEVEL.
  - B) WHENEVER INDIAN PEOPLE WANT DECISION MAKING AUTHORITY THE DEPARTMENT OF INDIAN AFFAIRS STEPS IN AND FORMS AN ORGANIZATION OF ITS OWN - LIKE THE REGIONAL FORUM AND THE WAY THIS FORUM IS SET UP IS CONTRADICTORY TO WHAT WE ENVISION AS INDIAN GOVERNMENT FOR OUR INDIVIDUAL NATIONS.

THE OCCUPATION OF THE BRITISH COLUMBIA REGIONAL OFFICE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF INDIAN AFFAIRS BY REPRESENTATIVES OF INDIAN GOVERNMENTS OF B.C. IN PROTEST OF THE SOCIO-ECONOMIC CONDITIONS OF INDIGENOUS PEOPLES IN CANADA BRINGS INTO QUESTION THE SINCERITY OF PIERRE TRUDEAU'S INTEREST IN THE WELL-BEING OF POOR PEOPLES. THE RECORD OF HIS GOVERNMENT IN DEALING WITH THE POOREST OF THE POOR IN CANADA IS ATROCIOUS. THE DISCREPANCY BETWEEN THE ECONOMIC SITUATION OF THE INDIGENOUS PEOPLES OF CANADA AND THAT OF OTHER PEOPLES PRESUMABLY SERVED BY THE CANADIAN GOVERNMENT ADMINISTRATION OF THE WEATH OF UPPER NORTH AMERICA HAS INCREASED SIGNIFICANTLY DURING THE LAST 15 YEARS.

THE SOCIO-ECONOMIC SITUATION OF PEOPLES IN THE 'SOUTH' ABOUT WHICH TRUDEAU IS PRESUMABLY SO CONCERNED IS DIRECTLY RELATED TO NON-NATIONAL PARTIES EXPLOITATION OF THE POOR PEOPLES' LAND AND RESOURCES COUPLED WITH TRANS-NATIONAL INVESTORS' SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF REPRESSIVE AND OPPRESSIVE REGIMES.

THE SAME CONDITIONS AND REASONS FOR THESE CONDITIONS APPLY
TO THE INDIGENOUS SITUATION IN CANADA. THE GOVERNMENT OF
PIERRE TRUDEAU IS EXPLOITING INDIGENOUS LANDS AND RESOURCES

WE THE ABORIGINAL WOMEN WHO ARE OCCUPYING THE B C REGIONAL OFFICES ARE WISHING NOW TO REPEAT THE STATEMENT THAT WE MADE ON JULY 21ST 1981.

THIS ORGANIZATION WAS SET UP BY A GROUP OF WOMEN WITHOUT ANY ORGANIZATIONS BACKING IT. IT WAS DONE THROUGH FRUSTRATION JUST PLAIN FED UP WITH THE WAY WE ARE TREATED BY THE DSEPARTMENT OF INDIAN AFFAIRS, COUNCILS AND INDIAN ORGANIZATIONS. THE MONEY IS GOING EVERYWHERE BUT TO THE COMMUNITY LEVEL PEOPLE. THE PITTANCE THAT INDIAN ORGANIZATIONS DO GET THEY ARE FIGHTING OVER.

THE STAND WE ARE MAKING AS 'CONCERNED ABORIGINAL WOMEN' IS BORN FROM FRUSTRATIONS SUFFERED AT THE HANDS OF THE SEPARTMENT OF INDIAN AFFAIRS AND DIFFERENT ORGANIZATIONS. THE BAND LEVEL PEOPLE HAVE SO MANY DIFFERENT ORGANIZATIONS WORKING ON THEIR BEHALF THAT THE SITUATIONS AT THE BAND LEVEL ARE WORSENING. THE POVERTY THAT PEOPLE ARE EXPERIENCING AT THE BAND LEVEL ARE CAUSED BY THE CONTROLS SET UP BY GOVERNMENT POLICIES. THESE POLICIES ARE NOT GIVEN IN THE INTERESTS OF PEOPLE BUT IN THE INTERESTS OF GOVERNMENT BUREAUCRATS. THE CUT-BACKS IMPOSED BY GOVERNMENT ON THE DEPARTMENT OF INDIAN AFFAIRS IS FELT, HARDEST BY THE BAND MEMBERS AT THE COMMUNITY LEVEL. WE HAVE NO SECURITY SUCH AS THE OTHER WORKER GROUPS HAVE IN THAT WE CANNOT STRIKE TO BRING OUR STANDARD OF LIVING UP TO PAR WITH THE REST OF THE COUNTRY. THE WORKERS AT THE COMMUNITY LEVEL ARE AT THE MERCY OF THE PEOPLE WHO ARE DOLING OUT THE MONEY. OUR RESOURCES ARE NOT BEING USED TO MAKE LIFE BETTER FOR COMMUNITY PEOPLE AS A WHOLE BUT HELP DEVELOP CORPORATIONS OF RICH INDIVIDUALS.

FRED WALCHLI: WE WON'T TALK TO HIM BECAUSE WE DON'T TRUST HIM, BECAUSE OF THE WAY HE HAS HANDLED OTHER SITUATIONS DEALING WITH INDIANS.

- A) BANDS ARE CONTINUOUSLY WAITING FOR FUNDING FOR BAND OPERATIONS.
  THIS CAUSED ALOT OF FRUSTRATION BEING SUFFERED BY THE COMMUNITY
  PEOPLE AND WORKERS AT THE COMMUNITY LEVEL.
- B) WHENEVER INDIAN PEOPLE WANT DECISION MAKING AUTHORITY THE DEPARTMENT OF INDIAN AFFAIRS STEPS IN AND FORMS AN ORGANIZATION OF ITS OWN LIKE THE REGIONAL FORUM AND THE WAY THIS FORUM IS SET UP IS CONTRADICTORY TO WHAT WE ENVISION AS INDIAN GOVERNMENT FOR OUR INDIVIDUAL NATIONS.

#### DEMANDS:

- WE DEMAND THE RESIGNATION OF FRED WALCHLI BECAUSE OF THE POLITICAL MANNER IN WHICH HE DISPERSES FUNDS TO THE INDIAN PEOPLE. WE THEREFORE DEMAND A MEETING WITH THE MINISTER OF INDIAN AFFAIRS.
- WE DEMAND AN INDEPENDENT INQUIRY INTO ACTIVITIES OF THE DEPT. OF INDIAN AFFAIRS IN THE B C REGION.

WE HAVE RECEIVED A LETTER SIGNED BY MR. WALCHLI ON WEDNESDAY, 22ND OF JULY, 1981 WHERE HE PROPOSED A MEETING WITH THE DELEGATES FROM OUR GROUP IN OTTAWA. WE WOULD LIKE A MEETING WITH YOU BUT NOT IN OTTAWA. WE WOULD LIKE FOR YOU TO COME TO VANCOUVER AND YOUR RESPONSE SHOULD BE TO CUR GROUP DIRECTLY AND NOT THROUGH MR. WALCHLI. WE CANNOT BE SURE THAT MR. WALCHLI IS ONVEYING THE TRUE OFFER OF THE MINISTER OR THAT HE MAY CONVEY OUR RESPONSE CORRECTLY. BECAUSE OF OUR MISTRUST, WE CANNOT BE SURE HE WON'T MANIPULATE THE SITUATION.

THE REASONS FOR REQUESTING THAT YOU COME TO VANCOUVER ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- OUR GROUP MADE DECISIONS TOGETHER AND WE WOULD LIKE TO MEET YOU AS A GROUP.
- 2. THE GROUP IS ASKING FOR A MEETING WITH YOU TO COME TO B. C. AND SEE FOR YOURSELF WHAT IS REALLY HAPPENING AT THE BAND LEVEL.
- 3. IT WOULD BE MUCH CHEAPER FOR YOU TO COME TO B. C. RATHER THAN A GROUP OF DELEGATES GOING TO OTTAWA. THE MONEY WOULD BE COMING FROM OUR ALREADY EXHAUSTED FUNDING.

THE IAA ACKNOWLEDGES RECEIPT OF THE TLX THAT EXPRESSES SO CLEARLY YOUR DEEP SENSE OF FRUSTRATION BEING FELT BECAUSE OF THE MANY COMPLEX BLOCKS THAT ARE HOLDING UP INDIAN SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND ERODING INDIAN RIGHTS. THE PRIME MINISTER OF CANADA CONTINUES TO FOCUS HIS ATTENTION ON FOREIGN AFFAIRS WHILE THE INTERNAL MATTERS OF CANADA ARE BEING NEGLECTED.
HOW CAN INDIAN GOVERNMENTS EVEN FUNCTION WHEN THERE IS NO MAIL SERVIE FOR 3 WEEKS? HOW CAN THE MINISTER OF DIA FULFILL HIS OBLIGATIONS AS TRUSTEE FOR INDIANS WHEN HIS GOVERNMENT CANNOT MANAGE THE DOMESTIC AFFAIRS OF CANADA? TEN MILLION DOLLARS HAVE BEEN SPENT ON HOLDING AN ECONOMIC SUMMIT CONFERENCE HOSTED BY PM TRUDEAU. THEIR OPENING REMARKS WERE THAT THEY BELIEVED THEY COULD NOT RESOLVE THE PROBLEMS OF CANADA AND OTHER COUNTRIES. IF SO, WOULDN'T IT BE BETTER IF P TRUDEAU SPENT HIS TIME ON INDIAN LAND CLAIMS AND DEVELOPMENT. THE REFUGEES WHO HAVE COME FROM SOUTHEAST ASIA ARE OFTEN GETTING GREATER OPPORTUNITIES THAN THE INDIGENOUS PEOPLE IN WHAT IS NOW CANADA. IS THAT JUSTICE? WE MUST TELL THE PUBLIC HOW WE FEEL ABOUT IT. WHY SHOULD THERE BE A SHORTAGE OF FUNDS TO MEET THE INDIAN OBLIGATIONS WHEN TEN MILLION DOLLARS CAN BE SQUANDERED FOR A MTG THAT PRODUCES NOTHING BUT IDLE DISCUSSION IN AN ENVIRONMENT OF LUXURY? HELENE GLADUE, EXEC SEC, OF THIS ORGANIZATION ESPECIALLY SHARES YOU VALID CONCERNS. SHE SAYS THAT IN NORTHEAST ALBERTA INDIAN PEOPLE ARE STILL GETTING THEIR WATER FROM DUG OUTS AND SUING OUTDOOR TOILETS WHILE ALL AROUND THEM THERE IS THE AFFLUENCE OF OIL, GAS AND OIL SANDS DEVELOPMENTS. IN THE SAME AREAS THERE IS STILL HIGH UNEMPLOYMENT AMONG OUR PEOPLE WHILE INDUSTRIES BRING SKILLED AND UNSKILLED WORKERS FOR OTHER PARTS OF CANADA AND THE WORLD. WHILE WE SUPPORT FULLY YOU DETERMINATION TO PROTEST THE IAA FEELS COMPASSION FOR RESERVE CHIEFS AND COUNCILS WHO ARE ATTEMPTING TO ACCOMPLISH SOCE AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REGARDLESS OF THE CONFUSION AND INTIMIDATION CAUSED BY DIAND AND THE CANADIAN GOVERNMENT. OUR RESERVE LEADERS ARE BEING FORCED TO FIGHT ON MANY FRONTS AT THE SAME TIME WHILE STILL CARING FOR THE PEOPLES NEEDS AND INTERESTS. WE SHARE YOU BELIEF THAT DIAND ARE INSENSITIVE, CLUMSY AND SUBVERSIVE IN THE WAY THEY RUN THEIR DEPARTMENT. IN THIS PROVINCE DIAND HIRED A CONSULTANT TWO YEARS AGO TO BUILD A. CASE TO FORCE OUR RESERVES TO SPEND THEIR OWN FUNDS ON DISCRETIONARY PROGRAMS. THE CHIEFS IN ALBERTA REJECT THAT POLICY BU THROUGH QUESTIONABLE MANIPULATIONS DIAND ARE STILL TRYING TTO IMPOSE THAT POLICY. THE SAME CONSULTANT HAS BEEN GIVEN ANOTHER CONTRACT OVER OUR THE IAA SUGGESTS THAT YOU PUSH FOR AN ENGUIRY INTO DIA PROTESTS. ADMINISTRATION JUST AS THE INDIAN WOMEN IN WHAT IS NOW ALBERTA DID IN 1976. WE DO NOT THINK IT HELPS OUR OVERALL SITUATION TO LEVEL CRITICISM AT THE INDIAN ORGANIZATIONS WHO ARE AT THIS TIME IN THE MIDDLE OF A LIFE AND DEATH STRUGGLE OVER INDIAN RIGHTS BECAUSE OF THE DANGER OF NEGATIVE EFFECTS COMING THROUGH PATRIATION OF THE PROPOSED CONSTITUTION OF CANADA. We would like you to know that Women Working For Women In Prison totally supports the demands of the Concerned Aboriginal Women as outlined during their recent occupation of the DIA offices. Women Working For Women In Prison is a Vancouver based women's organization that represents women prisoners' interests in Canada.

A few of us were fortunate enough to participate in a meeting with these women at the Vancouver Indian Center and were deeply touched in our hearts by the strength, pride and justness of these Indian women. We felt that this action represented a resurgence of Indian pride and strength in their way of life and identity as Indians. Everyone we have met who has been in contact with these women has expressed a similar experience with the exception of course, of government bureaucrats and others of their kind.

We support an independant public enquiry into the DIA and demand the resignation of Fred Walchli. In these times of deepening recession and growing repression, many non-Indians are beginning to experience material poverty and the accompanying deadening of the spirit and mind that it brings. On this level we can identify with the Indian people. Unfortunately we do not have a tradition and way of life to look back upon that we can base our struggle upon, and so we have much that we can learn from the Indian people's traditional way of life, their respect for the earth and their spirituality.

We have sent a telegram to John Munro expressing our support of the Aboriginal Women and asked that all charges against them be dropped, and also sent a similar letter to Fred Walchli.

The agents and accessories of the law, the robe judges and offstare courts, the earnest lawyers, the rudy rich, the armed policemen are enough to keep even the reluctant among us in some kind of social ordre. But if you are confined to a life of social isolation, what if you are dependent on handouts for your daily bread and a roof over your head, what if you can see no opportunity for your children, what if your most of your family is repeatedly without meaningful work, what if too many of your friends are dunk drunk most much of the time and if too many of the young people in your clan kill themselves for lack of anything better todo,. Then document called the Supreme Court Order telling you your clumsy protest is beyond the law, it is simply another piece of paper. Most-the of the 53 people that had to be carried from the Vancouver Regional Office of the Department of Indian Affairs, this week, were not militant young men, they were women. Women in every society are the last to protest, the most reluctant to defy the social code. Contrary to some claims these Indian women are also unlikely to be the pawns of other protestors. They are far more likely to have undertaken there sit in from a genuine sense of frustrattion if not desperation. But most non Indinas know of reserve life, is the glimpse they get driving by on the road. The houses they remember are the hobb havels surrounded by debris. The mind set which to often remains is that these are peppel who refuse to help themselves. It is a verdict reached without evidence and certainly without charity. Of course everyone knows that something tis dreadfully wrong within the segment of Canadian society which is Indian. Paternalism has been a dismal failure. IN one 6 week period in recent years, there were 8 suicides amongst Cowichan Indian Band in Duncan. Almos all-teens-and all people in there teens and 20ties. What greater measure of failure can there be? The INidans staging their sit in in Vancouver this month demanded the Department's Regional Director be fired. Apart from the fact such eveidence

action without evidence would be patently unfair. NO government could acede to such demands and hope to retain a civil service. They also demanded a meeting with Indian Affairs MInister: Jhhn Munro and were offered one in Ottawa provided they end their protest. Mr. Munro should have come to hear them, that is his job. Lastly they demanded an independent inquiry into living conditions on reserve and oportuntly the government should seize because it comes at the "behest of reserve residents. Such an inquiry would reveal to the rest of us what is making the peopõe who live there so desperate. It might produce some better idea of what to do about it.
