CFB CALGARY has a huge, lovely new community centre. Twenty-five percent of the Currie Community Centre is controlled by the women. The front page of their information pamphlet prints, "Woman, wife and mother, Be I one, two, or all three, I know the most important one is ME". The CFB Calgary Women's Centre is a drop-in and activity place where all woman in the military community are welcome and encouraged to visit and make use of the many programmes and presentations offered by the centre. A babysitting co-op is also available in this community centre. We have spoken to the executive of the Women's Centre, and they have agreed to assist us in some of our objectives.

A letter writing campaign has been initiated for a FAMILY DENTAL PLAN. Representatives from CFB Calgary, Edmonton, and Cold Lake have been contacted and a joint effort from as many bases as possible will soon be in the works.
