

WHO ARE WE?

The Sudbury Women's Centre is a bilingual, non-profit organization dedicated to improving the status of women in Northern Ontario, through public education, advocacy, and political action.

The Centre is administrated by a volunteer Steering Committee. Any woman may join the Women's Centre and participate in the monthly Steering Committee meetings.

WHAT DO WE DO?

Referral Service The Centre refers women in crisis to agencies in the community who can provide programs and services that address their specific needs or concerns. Local agencies and organizations also utilize our referral service.

Resource Library The Centre's library contains over 600 volumes, as well as periodicals and audio/visual materials on issues of concern to women.

Legal Advice Clinic The Centre operates a monthly legal information clinic for women. The service is free, and is provided by a woman lawyer who volunteers her time.

Public Education The Centre organizes workshops and conferences on issues of concern to women; such as: affirmative action, day care, sexual assault, pay equity, and reproductive choice.

<u>Public Speaking</u> The Centre provides speakers free of charge to schools, community groups, and conferences.

Advocacy The Centre advocates for the rights of women by presenting briefs to commissions, organizing lobbies, supporting other women's groups, and organizing public education events. We have worked actively with unions, professional organizations, and women in the home. Topics have included: pay equity, Free Trade, midwifery, and social assistance.



Resource Centre The Centre provides space for groups to meet on a regular or ad hoc basis. Fees are determined by the group's ability to pay. The Centre supports special activities or ad hoc groups. Examples are: The Ontario Day Care Coalition, The Anti-Porn Research Group, The Pro-Choice Coalition, Incest Survivors Group, and In the Best Interest of the Child Group.

Projects The Centre acts as the corporate sponsor for several projects each year. They have included: the writing of a resource handbook on health services and services for battered women; a feasibility study for a Parent-Child Resource Centre in Sudbury; a project to develop resources for Francophone women who wish to start small businesses; and the development of an instructional unit for secondary schools on Northern Women's Herstory Issues. During the summer months, special activities are organized which may include a women's self-defence workshop, an aerobics class, a women's retreat, and activities concerning women and the environment, and women and health. Currently, the Centre is conducting a feasibility study to demonstrate a community need for a Women's Health Centre.

<u>Student Placement</u> The Centre regularly supervises student placements from Laurentian University, Cambrian College, FUTURES, The Sudbury Board of Education's STAY program, and S.E.E.D. students.

Networking The Centre networks, not only with other Northern Ontario women's groups, but also with women's groups across Canada and around the world.
