Because the governments' cutbacks all over the world are having their greatest effects on women it is important for lesbian women to come out and make our fight more publicly than ever. In Canada, the Family Allowance Protest* which was launched by the Toronto Wages for Housework Committee has given us the opportunity to do this. Our statement of support is enclosed. We have mailed it, along with the petition, to women's groups, newspapers, community organizations, unions, and every lesbian and gay organization in Canada. It is also being circulated in many areas where women are canvassing door-to-door with the petition.

What can you do to support your Canadian sisters?

- * If you publish a newspaper or newsletter print the petition and the Wages Due Lesbians statement in your next issue.
- * Circulate the petition to spread the news about the Protest, especially to groups of lesbian women.

We are eager to speak to any individual or groups of lesbian women about the Wages for Housework Campaign and how we can better organize to fight against the cutbacks. Contributions would be greatly appreciated. Thank you.

* The Family Allowance is the \$22/month per child received by every mother in Canada. It is indexed to the cost of living. That scheduled increase was cut back in December.
