# SPY CAMERAS ON THE JOB WHO WILL BE NEXT?

At Puretex Knitting Co. in North York, 200 women workers make men's sweaters and shirts. For the last two years, 9 TV cameras have been trained on them all day. From the plant gates, the factory floor and even the washroom doors. Inside his office, the Company President watches separate screens.

Most of the women earn \$3.60 to \$3.75 an hour, working under tension increased by the cameras' watchful eyes.


On November 13, they went on strike for:

removal of the cameras; decent pay and better conditions
