INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

was established in 1910 to honour the efforts
of women workers. The date was chosen because
on March 8, 1909, 15,000 women workers
marched through New York City demanding
shorter working hours, safe working conditions, equal
pay and the right for women to vote. For the first time
in history, the international spotlight
was on women's concerns.

To this day, March 8 continues to be celebrated throughout the world. Yet it is also a reminder that, despite having made many gains, women continue to be discriminated against both in the workplace and in society at large.

Your union is working to eliminate that.


