

WOMEN'S SOLIDARITY DAY AT IRWIN TOYS



- On June 17, 104 workers at IRWIN Toys in Etobicoke went on strike for a first contract.
- The majority of workers are women and most make the minimum wage.
- After months of fruitless negotiations, the company offered five cents above the minimum wage, no seniority rights, no benefits.
- In other words, no union. Like Fleck, Radio Shack, Fotomat and Blue Cross, women are pitted against a multi-billion dollar employer for the right to a union.
- An American strike breaking company has been hired to help bust the strike. They drive transports, truck scabs through the picket lines. Their security guards snap pictures of picketers and demand police escorts for scabs.

With the help of women's groups and trade unionists, we can win union rights. Without a union women have no rights at all. Support your sisters at Irwin Toys, Come out to the picket line—
