

access to information concerning women The Women's Resource Centre was established Summer '83 in order to provide access to information concerning women. There exists in academia, and in society as a whole, a distinct lack of information about the economic, legal, social, cultural and political aspects of womens' lives. There are omissions, distortions and trivializations rampant in what little research is currently available.

There are many questions, such as:

- 1. Historically, what did women do and how were world events experienced through their eyes?
- 2. Which, if any, of the characteristics taken to be universally true about the female personality are innate?
- 3. Which of these characteristics are learned through the process of socialization?
- 4. What is the nature of the relationship between women and culture, literature and the economic and political system?
- 5. What are the possibilities for social change?

The Women's Resource Centre functions to allow people a comfortable environment to address these questions.

The Women's Resource Centre Coalition is comprised of persons interested in fulfilling the Centre's statement of purpose. The Coalition is the decision-making body for the Centre and meets regularly to discuss and organize the Centre's process of development, activities, services and operation.
