Nightwood's mandate is to develop work by Canadian women theatre artists creating alternative visions of the world from diverse cultural perspectives. Pieces selected for workshop are usually risky, representing the beginnings of new work by established artists and the first steps of emerging artists.

Groundswell offers writers, directors and actors a chance to try out short pieces (15 to 45 minutes), or extracts from longer works, in a supportive environment. Plays, performance art, collaborative creations or any feminist theatrical initiatives are welcomed.
