What's happening next?



A worker's co-operative of women, Second Story Press arrives with the encouragement of writers, the book industry, readers of adult feminist and children's literature and many friends and associates. It is also the new child of a group of women steeped in the past two decades of the women's movement and sixteen years of feminist publishing.

With Second Story Press we are aiming to create a dynamic organization with an open and challenging editorial program. As long time producers of feminist books, we have supported writers in their exploration of their lives, their history and their changing place in society. We've worked with writers who have broken traditional boundaries in form and content. Second Story Press hopes to move us farther yet. Women—our diverse lives, our experiences and our dreams—are in a process of constant change. We want to be there to help articulate and document the profound challenges women are making to the status quo. We also want to participate in defining a more humane, equitable and non-oppressive society.

As a publisher, Second Story Press will embrace a broad range of new writing for adults and young people, for readers of both fiction and non-fiction. We are eager to promote a diversity of voices, debates and opinion—a rich potpourri of literature, encompassing familiar forms as well as experimental, popular along with scholarly writing, Canadian together with some international titles.

We are interested in developing a list that looks at the world through many critical eyes. We hope that our books will examine women's experience, the issues that affect our lives and the concerns that are important to our futures. Hence we want to do books that look at current events as well as history. Second Story Press will be looking for titles that evaluate our political, social, economic and personal lives through a variety of genres. Whether for adults or for young people, we are committed to quality literature, well-written and challenging. We want to do great books that readers will talk about, criticize and remember.
