GROUPS NEEDING VOLUNTEERS? AND MEMBERS

Interval House is a co-operative house where sole support mobbers can stay for a month or more while adjusting to a new and independent life. It was set-in last winter and accommodates five women and their children. Of course it is not adequate to neet the needs of women in distress in Toronto. Police Phamphlet on Self-Defence for Women

A phamphlet is being circulated in Toronto apartment buildings and public places by the Metro Police Department called "Woman Alone" and its purpose seems to be to terrify women who are living in the city to stay home. Some of its typical bits of advice are: "Avoid femining home identification; change mailbox tag from 'Mary Smith' to 'M. Smith'. Avoid hanging lingerie outside. Look inside car before antering intruder may be crouching on floor in rear. Be way of strangers in conversation; avoid giving your name, residence or work location. The phamphlet puts the whole burden of avoiding rape and other attacks on the woman. Nowhere does it mention anything about the penalties for rape and assault, or warn men against hounding women on the street. Alderwomen Anne Johnston, Elizabeth Eayrs and North York Controller Barbara Greene have raised objection s to the phamphlet too.
