ASWAC received the cheque for \$45,467 from the Wild Rose Foundation, purchases were approved at the board meeting and we have officially begun the Volunteer Development and Support Project.

The hiring process for the Volunteer Co-ordinator is underway. A photo copier and two FAX machines (one each for the Calgary and Edmonton offices) have been purchased. We have a laser printer, Microsoft Word computer program and My MailList label maker and data organizer. The McIntosh computer will be delivered sometime in January.

We feel very fortunate to have these resources and would like to share them with other community groups. A plan to do this at a very reasonable cost and with training in the use of the equipment will be developed when the Volunteer Co-ordinator joins us.

A Wellness Association

Update: With the assistance of the YWCA - Edmonton and the Royal Alexandra Hospital the planning committee developed a written proposal for the establishment of a "CENTRE FOR WOMEN."

Representatives from the Planning Committe have met with government officials, Edmonton Board of Health, Alberta Advisory Council for Women and the City of Edmonton. Foundations have been approached for funding.

A volunteer Board of Directors will direct the establishment of the Centre for Women; health education, information and referrals.

The Program Summary reads in part: The Centre For Women understands the health issues facing women and provides up to date information and services to enable any woman to make an informed decisions regarding her own or her family's health.

And: Without duplicating existing community services or health care programs, the Centre for Women will provide a single health information resouce available to all women.
