Invitations will be issued as soon as the Tory leadership convention is held. TV stations will be approached and venues will be searched out.

Thousands of women have told NAC, in our Federal Election Survey, that they believe NAC should try to organize a leadership debate.

And I agree with those women.

But we need to deliver the same message to our country's leaders.

And that's why I am asking you today to send the enclosed post cards -- postage free -- to three party leaders.

Politicians must go on record when it comes to presenting options to the women of Canada.

NAC will make a difference to women in this election. But only if we have the support of people like you.






