ALTERNATE SCHOOL PROGRAM & KITCHENER SCHOOL PROGRAM

- consists of two women who work with children and their parents, offering guidance and support for families whose children are having difficulty in school. The staff are Liason Workers in the Kitchener School Area.

Family Work

- Provide a general counselling and referral service for native families who are experiencing problems in the city.
- Provide support and emergency services to native women and their children.
- Help to develop urban and neighbourhood support systems for native people living in Regina.

Residence Resource Centre

"This is a home for native women and children which offers a short term living situation for families in crisis situations. The staff provide guidance, support and counselling.

Treatment Centre

This is a group home for young women (ages 16 -25) who are encountering problems. The women living at the house recieve help from the staff through support, counselling and referrals. Recreational and learning activities are also available.
