GUEST EDITORIAL

Womonspace... whatever possesed our founding sisters to call Edmonton's own lesbian organization 'Womonspace'? Are there not words in our vocabulary to describe a place where womyn may gather to share ideas and feel good doing a variety of silly and serious things? One must deduce that after intensive research in English, Latin, Greek, and Lesbos dictionaries, no such word was found.

In a way, it is not at all surprising that no existing words could hold up the weight of some one hundred womyn bent on improving the world for their sister lesbians. Our society was not created for womyn uniting and <u>doing</u> things. We have long ago been taught that one cannot change the world. "OTHERS" rule and dictate what we must and mustn't do, manage our money and set our dreams.

The time has come, however, for this attitude to change. Every womon has within her the capabilities to do great deeds and Womonspace wants to supply the needed "space" and support. Hundreds of worthwhile projects are discussed at the Roost, at dances, in lesbians' homes and at Womonspace meetings. Unfortunately, very few ever get organized. The basic problem is rarely a lack of support or a lack of funds (yes, Womonspace does have a healthy bank account!). That which is lacking is womyn to stand up and say: "I will organize a ski trip."; "I'm looking for two other womyn to start a Human Rights committee."; "I'd like to negotiate a week-end womyn's night at the club. Do I have Womonspace's support?"

Womonspace's activities and programs are not dictated by some holy writ. They are conceived and acted upon by lesbian womyn who have decided to spare some of their time for the good of other lesbians. No one political idea is pushed upon anyone. I have never witnessed such a diverse group of persons working together. Conservatives, radicals, feminists, traditionalists, closet cases, clubbies, mothers, "older" lesbians, professionals, students, and yes, even posties. All can find a space within Womonspace.

As you all settle down to your work routines after a relaxing summer (some of us apparently enjoyed holidays!) please consider what time you can set aside for a good deed to the lesbian community. It might be a half-day a month, six hours in October or a few minutes here and there. All this time can be effectively used for the planning of an activity or for serving on a committee. Womonspace needs all the energy that the lesbians of Edmonton can spare.

Let's pull together and make Womonspace a true reflection of the lesbian community of Edmonton.

LADIES AGAINST WOMEN

As is often the case, when Phyllis Schlafly recently spoke in Knoxville, TN, she was greeted by the local chapter of Ladies Against Women (LAW). Using satire as their form of protest, the Ladies were properly dressed (as all ladies must be when they find themselves in the public eye). They held "supportive" signs such as, "We worship Phyllis, she's our man", "Roses are red/Violets are blue/ Sperm & eggs are people too -Protect the right of the Unconceived", and one banner featuring a drawing of a wire coat hanger with the words "Let's go back to the good old days - Ban Legalized Abortion Now". The group handed out LAW membership cards with the slogan, "I'd rather be ironing", and a line for the husband's permission signature, which the card must have to be valid. Gaily colored buttons with the slogan, "Born to Clean" were also distributed to any lady who would take one.

U OF A WOMEN'S CENTRE

The University of Alberta Women's Centre received a grant from the federal government this spring. The Centre used it to hire 6 people; 3 to establish a resource centre, and 3 to write a handbook. These projects are meant to increase the awareness of people towards the conditions of women in our society, and on our campus.

The Women's Centre handbook is currently being completed. It begins with an article outlining the history of the women's movement on the U of A compus, leading up to the aspirations of the Centre for the coming year. Following this article is an alphabetical listing of, and comment on, some of the services and issues which directly involve women. (i.e. Accessibility, Birth Control, Counselling, etc.) Under each letter there will be space for personal phone numbers and addresses. It is hoped that by making the handbook useful, including a cadendar and room for notes, people will be encouraged to keep it with them throughout the year. Funding is limited, however. If anyone has ideas of ways to raise money, or would like to make a donation. please contact the Centre.

The Women's Centre is also putting together a Resource Centre composed of a library and filing system. Because the purpose of the Resource Centre is to educate people on women's issues, we are maintaining two focuses when looking for materials. First on the list is information which shall stimulate a desire in the community to develop an active concern for women's issues. Consequently, we hope to acquire the classics of feminist reading.

Our second focus is on academic materials which we expect will help

students research term-papers on women's issues. We are looking for information on feminist philosophies, psychology, and literature; on the history of the suffrage movement. particularly in Canada; and on violence against women. Again, funding for these ideas is a problem; financing a comprehensive Resource Centre is extremely expensive. For this reason, the women's community is asked to contribute any relevant information: books, periodicals, essays, pamphlets, posters, music, or films. Please call 432-2882 or come down to the Centre. It is located in room 270 of the Student's Union Bldg.


Womonspace is its members. You are Womonspace. Your participation directs what happens in the group.

WEN-DO WORKSHOP

Wen-Do is a system of selfdefense designed for womon; many members of our community have been involved in Wen-Do and report increased self-confidence and a stronger sense of security. The workshop includes both theory and hands-on learning.

This workshop will not be restricted to Womonspace members only. Womonspace donated \$200 to Wen-Do early in 1984 and this workshop will be subsidized for Womonspace members. DANCE MEETING


The meeting is being held to update the co-ordinators' books. Former co-ordinators are urged to attend. Tuesday, September 18 at 7:30pm, E.W.P.
