

LIBERATION WORKSHOP FOR WOMEN



LIBERATION WORKSHOP is a series of courses for women conducted by the WOMEN'S PLACE, an organizing centre for women. Through this school we learn about ourselves, about our history, our roles in society, our strengths and our intellectual capabilities.

Each workshop meets once a week for 8 weeks at the WOMEN'S PLACE. Day and time for meetings will be determined by those in the course on registration night.

Classes are open to any woman who registers and who gives 5.00 per course, if possible, in order to keep the workshops running.

Fall courses begin October 2 and continue until November 24. Registration will be conducted on September 25 at 8:00 p.m.. Participants are invited to come to The Women's Place at 31 Dupont to register and meet with other women who will be involved in the workshops. If you can't come on that evening, please call so that we can make other arrangements.

If childcare is a problem, indicate this on your registration form, and we will help.

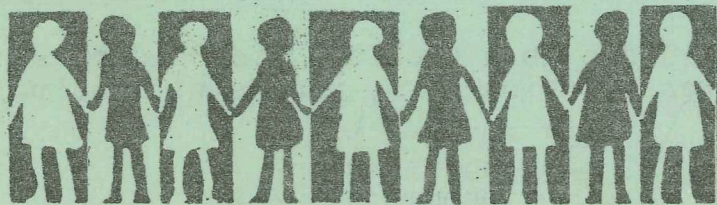

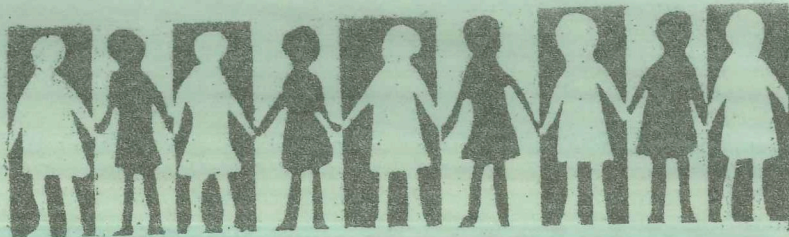
WOMEN IN THE HIGH SCHOOLS...An after school group for high school women about problems and concerns with school and family life. The focus will be on educating ourselves about women's oppression and organizing high schools to work for us. There will be a chance for reading, talking and participating in women's movement activities in Toronto.

SEX-ROLE STEREOTYPING IN CHILDREN...The members of this study group will meet regularly to review literature documenting the diverse and subtle ways in which sexual role stereotypes are internalized-evidenced in our lives. The emphasis of this group will be to form further action groups which will attempt to raise the public level of consciousness.

VARIOUS VIEWPOINTS ON THE WOMEN'S MOVEMENT... A series of 8 evenings with 8 different representatives of various facets of the women's movement, each discussing the movement from her own perspective.

CARPENTRY...This course will teach the use of tools and the basics of carpentry. Unfortunately, due to the number of women who responded to the last carpentry course, this one is already filled.





PSYCHOLOGY AND WOMEN...This course will look into the myths and theories about women as perpetrated by psychology, past and present. It will also look at socialization influences in childhood as factors which contribute to myths about women.

WOMEN IN CANADIAN LITERATURE...a study of the Canadian woman in imaginative literature, past and present.

WOMEN IN CANADIAN SOCIETY...An introduction to the role and position of women in Canadian society, starting with an examination of: female North American role ideology, women in crime, women's legal position, women in the labour force, women in the arts, the role of feminism and the rise of social change movements. These topics are subject to change according to group wishes.

FIX-IT...This course will be composed of 3 sections: basic plumbing, basic electrical repair and basic car mechanics. Skills will be taught by working on practical projects such as toilets, faucets, home appliances and cars. The course is designed to familiarize us with the tools necessary for these repairs.
