




The Archive

Growth

Over our first two years, Rise Up! has uploaded almost 1600 items to the website. This is a very labour intensive process involving many steps – scanning, OCRing, adding metadata and descriptions, checking for quality and accuracy, and finally uploading.

Original materials make up 95% of the archive. The number of pages on the Rise Up website with links to materials available on other sites is 5%.







The numbers

In our original fundraising letter, we committed to archiving three publications – a total of 68 items. Today the Rise Up! archive includes 1596 items. Our aim is to double that number over the next two years.







Region


Many of the first items on the website came from founding members of our collective and their friends and contacts who were active in Toronto. Ontario continues to be the most well-represented region on the website, by far.

Marginalized voices of feminist activism

Our goal is to preserve and make available online a wide range of materials documenting the diversity of grassroots feminist activists from the 1970s to the 1990s. This includes the significant, but often marginalized struggles by racialized, Indigenous, and immigrant women, as well as lesbians and women with disabilities. Our collection of these materials is growing, but there is much more to be done.



Fundraising

It will help us strengthen our network of volunteers and contributors, and our outreach to feminists across Canada. It will make it possible to digitize new materials and make website improvements more quickly.

Plans for Funds Raised




Finance



The Rise Up! archive has also benefitted from several university-based projects which included money for students to locate, scan, and OCR materials.


Donations

The majority of the donations we have received have come from many generous individual donors. Several organizations have also provided very helpful financial support.











Expenses

Governance

Incorporation

In January of 2018, Rise Up! finalized our governance plan and began the formal incorporation process. Last April, we held our first Annual General Meeting which adopted the proposed articles of incorporation and by-laws.

The governance plan defines different roles within Rise Up!, including that of the Board of Directors and Management Committee. It also includes our code of conduct and conflict of interest policies. This will ensure that all involved in the project - our stakeholders, donors, volunteers, and board – understand how the organization works and decisions are made.

Currently our Management Committee largely overlaps with the Board of Directors, but in the future we anticipate that Members of the Board will be less directly involved in the day to day operations of Rise Up!

Charitable Status

At this time, Rise Up! does not have charitable status. However, we have started the application process now that we have finalized our incorporation.

Charitable status will help reassure donors about the nature and stability of our organization and will also mean we can issue tax receipts.

We understand the waiting lists are long and it will take quite a while to complete all steps and hear whether we are accepted.
