"Better than last night, huh dear?"



"Hey!" she exclaims, "You're spilling to beer!" She hasn't noticed my neighbour. She makes me go back to my own seat.


I perch nervously beside "Squeaky" and hope she doesn't ask me if I want a bike ride.



I was ashamed.

- That it took a <u>man's</u> cynical laughter dipping over the steno pool to make me aware Judy Chicago's exhibit even existed. If he had not raucously insisted that the exhibit was mere feminist drivel, I would not have taken the time to go to Calgary and seen such a vibrant, solid celebration of women's achievements. And when I saw it - a magnificant triangular table surrounded by the names of 999 women and holding 39 place settings designed to represent the long history of female achievement - I was ashamed that I knew so few of the names.

I was amazed.

- At how perfectly Judy Chicago captured the beauty and the strength of the feminine and how history treated it; that all these women were gloriously unique but all uniformly condemned. Instead of being remembered and honoured, they were forgotten or misunderstood.






